MINUTES FROM THE JANUARY 15,2025

CHICAGO PARROTHEADS CLUB MEETING

LOCATION: ANOTHER ROUND

In attendance were, President Joe Klen, Secretary- John Sheridan, Social Director -Nancy Schriener, Treasurer- Doug MacArtney and Communications Director- Mario Armas and Cheryl Wegner- Membership Director. Absent: Cheryl Kuropas- Charity Director and Communications Director-Mario Armas



President Joe Klen started the meeting at 7:30 pm.

Joe thanked AnotherRound for allowing us to hold our monthly meetings here. And also, along those same lines, I thank our two servers Gigi and Ryan, so please remember again when your bill comes.

And a couple of other quick thanks. Thanks to Jeannie again for all the cookies. Thank you so much, and thank you to all those that are watching out in streamline. And lastly, Patrick for the newsletter.

All right, a couple of quick other announcements. Make sure you check our website. There's a lot of things happening pretty quick. We just actually completed our quarterly type of crew meeting.

So, there's a lot of events that we're kind of trying to engage and put forth. I think right now, we have titles on the dates and stuff that we think we're going to be doing these things. Some of them are filled in with the descriptions, and some are forthcoming. But along those lines, we have quite a few house concerts coming up too, and we are still looking for people who are interested in possibly hosting, you know, some of the performers that are coming to town. So, if you have the area, you have the room and you're interested, please talk to Cheryl Wegner, she's the one that will try to coordinate all that information.

We still have 50/50. It's still going to be live, probably for about another 20 minutes or so, and so everybody that's here or again at home in your nice, cozy chair, feel free to go ahead and sign up for that winner. Kathy stated, the pot is up to about \$175 for the winners.

Joe stated they just recently met with the Go Explore Us Group, which is the management system for the state parks around the area, like the Illinois beach, State Park the star of rock and white planes. We're trying to kick things off, as far as you know, securing our date for 2026 for chill and, get the contract going, making sure that prices don't increase too much, if at all. We were really surprised, because they seemed as excited for us to do the chill of 2026 as we were there trying to see if they still wanted us.

They have a Jimmy Buffett night once a year or Starved Rock. And so now, what they did, they actually asked us what dates we wanted that may, you know, be somewhat convenient for us as a group to go down, and then they would actually make that date. It's open to the public for one night. It would be like a Friday night, a Saturday night, one of those two. I guess the rooms there sell out really quick. But given that we give them a date, they would reserve a few blocks, I don't know how many you know, obviously it depends on the date, but they would actually provide that to us for a discount. So, you would call in, identify yourself as a Chicago Parrothead, and they'd get you a pretty good discounted rate. I think it was like \$140 or something. So again, what we want to do is try to at least start, you know that relationship. See who might be interested in doing that. Cheryl Wenger stated they have dinner theater.

I think she's going to have something on Facebook, please put it out, and then we could tell them, and, you know, they could start planning it, whether it's a handful of people, or whether it's a dozen or two, that would be, that would be great to go down there and try to take advantage of that.

And then they also have things out there too that they're again, trying to get us to go to. They've got these tours, these like, you know, bald eagle tours, or these trains or what have you that they said they are able to provide for us. The lodges there are that one lodge they have at Starved Rock, I don't know if you've been unbelievably large, very, massive, very, very nice.

Joe called upon the officers that were in attendance to give their report. Mario is not here. He's kind of tied up at work and said he has nothing to say this month.

Cheryl K is also not here, but I believe either Cheryl W or Nancy is going to take part of the charity, or maybe they're going to share it, but we'll find out when they step up here.

So, the first one is Treasurer- Doug MacArtney. The money is all good and everything is fine.

Joe said we have a newer member here, Braden, who is going to entertain us, at the end of the meeting with the game that he has.

Next was Secretary- John Sheridan and he had nothing new to report.

Cheryl Wegner- Membership Director gave her report on membership.

Everybody, thanks for coming out, and thanks for coming last month to the Christmas Party that was a big success. We noticed everybody was having a good time, and everybody was sticking around too. So, thanks for coming out for that. We have a new member here tonight, Kathy Deitz.

Welcome to our meeting, and she's wearing her white lay. We know that means she's a new member. So, make her feel welcome and her friend Tom. That brings our membership to 164.

So, we've been talking about the Second City trip, and I got to tell you, the Second City part of it is just not working out things beyond our control, and we're going to junk that part of it. But we still have a bus for five hours for \$25 a person, and we still have a reservation at Pizza at Oven Grinder for 29 people. Do we want to do something different, looking for ideas on that. Scheduled for March 29th. Somebody just mentioned, like, make it a murder mystery on the bus. That might be fun, or put some kind of tour guide on the bus, or something.

We have Boomer and Quinton coming to our house on February 22 and I'll send out an email when that button is live for you to prepay your donations. And then March 9. Bob Carwin and Scott Southworth are coming for a show. So, watch your emails for a button on that too. When's that? That is March 9, and where is it? Probably our house that's on a Sunday morning.

Cheryl K wanted to say, we collect things for Ronald McDonald House. We collect the pop tops and we collect the hotel size to iletries. She lives in a third-floor walkup. So, you know, there's no sense in her carrying this stuff up to her house, if anybody would be willing to be the drop off person with those things and take them from the meetings and drop them off at Ronald McDonald House. Just holler. There's a house in Naperville, Chicago, Maywood and Winfield.

So, we're doing something with St. Baldrick's. Did somebody in here shave their head one time? Mario, did it. Okay, so we have a new member also, and he was going to be here tonight, but he fell ill. He's not here, his name is Pete Tomczuk.

All right, so he wrote us a long email, but I'm just going to summarize it and say, you know, we were talking about putting together a party and making that an event for ourselves, but it sounds like Pete's already got it going. So, what we have to do is go to his party, and that'll be on March 8th. He said we can tailgate in the parking lot and do shots in the parking lot. Inside, there's the donation part and the shaving heads and music and food. So, it'll be fun if it is on the calendar.

Jimmy Buffet night at Stark Rock. Jenny, you said you've been there, and Karen has been there too. They gave us dates to choose from, and August 1 is one of them, and that would probably be the best date that would work out for the club, which is a Friday, but, you know, so kind of marked it on your calendar. You come out Friday for Jimmy Buffett night, and you spend the night, and then the next morning the bald eagle hike. Mike Warren mentions that there are wineries in Utica.

Next up Social Director -Nancy Schriener. We've got lots of stuff already planned, and we've got lots of stuff in the works behind the scenes, so coming up first in two weeks, we've got Barefoot Children in the Sand over in Mishawaka with their partner clubs next door.

So last year we did a theme where we were the Blues Brothers. We're from Chicago. So of course, this year we are going to be Bears Super fans. If anybody saw us dressed, we did Don't be a Dika. CAC, crawl, that's what we're going with. We're going to get the fake mustaches, the fake stogies cup dressing, your best Bears gear, and we're taking over the Holiday Inn in Mishawaka. So, if you have any questions or you haven't got your tickets yet, I think there's still some available.

Next up on February 1, our friends over at the Shuck and Shack are having their second annual Beach Bash. They did it last year. I believe our friend Johnny played last year, possibly, I don't remember last we knew they were still working on music, so we don't know who's performing, but that is Friday.

What's winter without Groundhogs Day? And what's better than a bunch of Parrot Heads and Groundhogs partying together? So, we're organizing an outing at the Caddy Shack over in Rosemont by the outlet mall. We're going to hang out with the marine brothers at the Caddy Shack. We're going to celebrate Groundhog's Day and hope that the groundhog stays away and we don't have six more weeks of this.

As Cheryl mentioned, we've got Boomer and Quinton on the 22nd then coming up on the fifth. I went out of order, sorry. On February 15, we are finalizing details for the Chicago Wolves. February 15 is a Saturday. It's their Hawaiian shirt night. So, look for a link that'll probably be going up in the next day or so. Everybody's responsible for buying their own tickets. We're going to have a section all to ourselves, free, sure giveaway. So hopefully, I know in the past, we've done things with them, and we've had a pretty good turnout. Then, as Cheryl mentioned, we've got, on the ninth, the Bob Karwin, and Scott Southworth show, concert at her house again. Then on February 8 is St. Baldrick's. So that takes us all the way through March.

As you can see, we've got lots of things in the works, and there's still some yet to come for April and May and the rest of the year.

Lastly, really quick on a separate note, you know, we're a family everywhere. Parrotheads across the country of the world. We're a family. And unfortunately, one of our family down in Florida is battling cancer right now, and it's a pretty aggressive battle, and she's really struggling. Her name's Deb Harrison. Some of you probably know her. She was at chill. You couldn't have missed her. She had the colorful weights on blue, orange, whatever, because at the time, she was still coming out of her chemo. If it's alright with everybody, I'd like Doug to turn the camera around, and if we could just give a big shout out to say, we love you. Deb, I greatly appreciate it.

We've got another fundraiser coming up. We are doing squares for the Super Bowl, \$10 a square. We're going to be getting the link up for that real soon. Sign up. Give us your \$10 we're just going to fill in everybody's names until all the 100 squares are gone. Then once the grid is filled up, we'll draw numbers, we'll find a way to videotape it live, and then we're going to split it straight across the board, \$200 to the club, \$200 per quarter.

Next, President Joe, just a couple of things to recap on. As far as the Barefoot event out Mishawaka, if you look at the newsletter, I did put a link to their registration, so I'm not sure how many tickets are left, but if you are interested again, it's not this weekend, it's the following weekend, and it is a fantastic time, a couple of hours of drive, but this year's lineup that they have is fantastic. They have Jonas on Friday, and then they have the BeachBum band on Saturday, just one party after another, right there.

As far as the football scores go, just like Nancy said, it's going to kind of be old school, right? We're going to have a form where you could go online, fill out, pick the number of tickets that you want, and so on. That will be a countdown. So, you know how many tickets are left. There are only 100 squares available. We'll start them at 100 and you know, you can look at the site and you can see how many are left, and when it gets down to zero, that's it. At that point in time, I think Nancy will go ahead and just take a random square, fill in all the names, take a picture of it, and then after that, either we video or take another picture after we put the numbers on it so everybody's aware of you know, what they have as far as their score is concerned.
